CONGRESS VOTES

THE CARLISLE (KY.) MERCURY, THURS., MAR. 16, 1972-5

William P. Curtis Jr., Sixth Congressional District, Kentucky. On Monday there were two recorded votes on motions to suspend the rules and pass a like number of bills. Under suspension procedure, passage requires that two-thirds of those present vote in the affirmative.

H.R. 2589 requires that prospective jurors for service on federal juries must answer the race and occupation questions on the jury qualification form. Year 316. Nays 19. Yea 19. Passed March 8. Mr. Curtis did not vote.

H.R. 12828 liberalizes Veterans' Education Programs, including a 14 percent increase in the basic monthly allowance. Year 356. Nays 0. Mr. Curtis did not vote.

By a nonrecorded vote, the House on Wednesday requested a conference with the Senate on the Emergency School Aid and Higher Education bill H.R. 6991. Following this vote, a motion was made to instruct the House to confer to insist upon the three anti-nuclear provisions contained in the legislation passed by the House last November. These provisions were proposed outside for the transfer of students until appeals have been decided; forbid the use of federal monies to transport students; and forbid federal officials from requiring the use of state and local funds to transport students.

On a motion to table (kill) the motion to instruct, the House voted as follows: Year 139. Nays 270. Motion to table rejected, March 8.

On the original motion to instruct the conference agreement, Year 139. Nays 270. Motion to table rejected, March 8. Mr. Curtis voted yea.

Whether to agree to the conference report on the Equal Employment Opportunity Act of 1972 (H.R. 1760), Year 139. Nays 110. Agreed to, March 8. Mr. Curtis voted yea.

Whether to authorize an additional \$2 million for the International transportation exposition at Dulles Airport (VA.) in May (H.R. 1124). Year 278. Nays 109. Passed, March 8. Mr. Curtis voted yea.

Whether to pass the Marine Mammal Protection Act (H.R. 10420) which prohibits the killing of such mammals without a permit. Year 302. Nays 10. Passed March 9. Mr. Curtis did not vote.
