CHARLES ROBERT JONES
Charles Robert Jones, 97, Millersburg, died Wednesday, March 15, 1972, at the Bourbon County Hospital, Paris, after a short illness.

He was born in Nicholas County Feb. 18, 1875, the only son of Thomas and Elizabeth Peebles Jones. He was educated at Kentucky Wesleyan College in Millersburg and Smith School in Cynthiana. He was a farmer all of his life, having operated a farm which had been in his family since before 1800. He was a member of the Millersburg Presbyterian Church. His wife, the late Lella McClintock, Bourbon County, died in 1965.

He is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Malcolm McCulloch, Millersburg and Miss Katherine Jones, Nashville, Tenn.; two grandsons, Charles McCulloch, Pittsburg, Pa., and Gordon McCulloch, Las Cruces, N.M.

Services were held at 10:30 a.m. Saturday, March 18, at the M.E. Pruitt and Son Funeral Home, Millersburg, by Rev. Chris Herring. Burial in the Millersburg Cemetery.

At the time of Mr. Jones' death he was the oldest subscriber to the Carlisle Mercury. In the issue of Dec. 28, 1967, the Centennial issue of the Mercury, Mr. Jones was featured since the Mercury had gone to the Jones family at the same address for 100 years.

Fire destroys Ritchie house

A passing motorist saw the fire inside the house. He went to the house, found no one at home and called the Nicholas County Fire Department from inside the burning building.

The fire department, manned by a volunteer group with Woody Wilson as chief, responded.

Firemen were unable to save the house or its contents, which were described as a total loss.

Joseph H. Conley, Attorney of Carlisle, has been appointed Law Day USA chairman for Nicholas County for 1972 by the Kentucky Bar Association.

This will be the 15th annual nationwide observance of the event which was permanently proclaimed by the 87th Congress, "... as a special day of celebration by the American people in appreciation of their liberties and the reaffirmation of their loyalty to the United States of America."

Mr. Conley did his undergraduate work at the University of Kentucky and received his law degree from Salmon P. Chase College. He is City Attorney for the City of Carlisle and legal counsel of the Carlisle-Nicholas County Housing Commission, Inc. He and his wife, Joan, have three children, Michael 10, Kathryn 9, and Margaret 6.

He is the son of the late Dr. and Mrs. B. E. Boone Jr., Elkton and has been engaged in the general practice of law here since shortly after he returned from active duty with the Navy in World War II. He is a graduate of Vanderbilt and Vanderbilt Law School, he also holds his Master's Degree from Columbia University School of Law. This is his first elective office.
