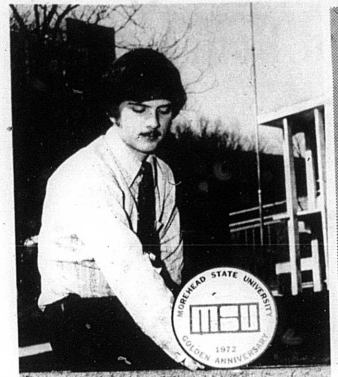

EKU among ten named to train women officers

Eastern Kentucky University was one of 10 universities nationwide Thursday by the Department of the Army to begin training women students in their Reserve Officer Training Corps programs beginning with the 1972 fall semester.

The program is a five-year pilot project that, for the first time, will permit women to be commissioned as second lieutenants through Army ROTC participation.

EKU president Robert R. Martin was informed of the Army's announcement Thursday morning by Senator John Sherman Cooper. Eastern was the first choice of five institutions nominated by the Army for the women's ROTC training program. In addition, verities are Pennsylvania State University, Louisiana State University, Texas A.M. University, South Dakota State University, Arizona State University and the University of Hawaii.

Eastern currently has the second largest voluntary ROTC program in the nation with 670 cadets enrolled on the Richmond campus.
