### Auditions to be held April 9 for Pioneer Playhouse talent

Casting Auditions For experienced adult and Collegiate Singers and Dancers for the State Theatre of Kentucky. Pioneer Playhouse 12 week Musical Theatre season will be held in Danville, Sunday, April 9 at 8:00 p.m. Auditions will be held in the Centre College Fine Arts Building located on East Lexington Avenue. (The building is adjacent to Danville High School). Productions scheduled to date include the Broadway Musicals Can-Can and New Moon by Sigmund Romberg.

Singers should be prepared to sing two contrasting selections which may include operatic Broadway material. You will be expected to sing without microphones; will be asked to read some lines and may be requested to demonstrate stage presence. It is important that you bring your own music, and that it be well marked for the accompanist. Even though we will provide an accompanist, you may wish to use your own.

Dancers should be in practice to demonstrate your stage presence and will be expected to do combinations following the instructions from our choreographer. Dancers may also display a two minute prepared dance to your own music. You may bring your own records or tapes provided you have the necessary equipment to reproduce them. The audition usually covers ballad, modern and jazz dancing.

All applicants will be asked to engage in conversation to determine the quality of your speaking voice. Resumes will also be accepted in advance from those persons intending to audition on April 9. These resumes should state your instrumental abilities and their proficiency level, as well as any professional production experience.
