## Homemakers meet at University of Kentucky

Sixteen Nicholas county homemakers club members met with approximately 1700 other Kentucky women at the annual conference of the Kentucky Extension Homemakers Association, March 21-24 on the campus of Lexington. During the program, they were urged by state president, Mrs. Philip Harrison of Harrison county, to "join hands across the state for a greater Extension program for all Kentuckians".

Mrs. Harrison said she was amazed at what past KEHA presidents had accomplished. She has a membership of 30,000 in Kentucky by March of 1974, when her three-year term expires.

Mrs. George Dale, Bluegrass area vice president attended two days of special board and committee meetings and dinners before the general program opened on Wednesday evening with a special tribute to the late Myrtle Weldon, Miss Weldon, who died last November, was the state leader of the Home Economics Extension Program from 1924 until her retirement in 1955. She is warmly remembered by many Nicholas county homemakers. Following the memorial service, Mrs. Dale, as a member of the state board, served at the punch bowl during the reception for the homemakers in the Student Center.

Thursday morning's program included guests from UK Co-operative Extension Service administrators Dr. Doris Linche, director, and Dr. Doris Linche, assistant director of home economics. Mrs. Earl Friedl, Georgetown, gave a report on her experiences as a delegate to the Associated County Women of the World's Triennial meeting in Norway last summer, and Lloyd county homemaker, Mrs. Samuel White, Jr., spoke on "Priorities for Progress".

Out-of-state speaker "Missy" Johnson told delegates about the opportunities for self-enrichment through fine arts activities and programs in Homemakers clubs. Johnson is cultural arts chairman of the National Extension Homemakers Council.

Part of the afternoon was given over to rap sessions in which homemakers received training in leadership skills and how to become more effective volunteers in various programs and activities at home. That evening, Kentucky winning Master Farm Homemakers for the year were presented to the conference. They were Mrs. James Herman Rafferty, Daviess county, Mrs. Charles Snowwell, Ballard county, and Mrs. Earl Bellamy, Jr., Todd county.

Also on Thursday evening the Kentucky Homemakers Chorus presented a concert. Mrs. Hecht Lackey was director and Mrs. A.J. Davidson, accompanist. Nicholas county homemakers who participated in the chorus were Mrs. J.M. Pitman, Mrs. John Clifton, Mrs. Harvey Wilson, Mrs. Billy M.
