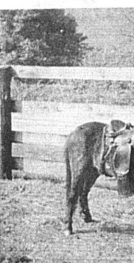
A certificate of merit for outstanding services rendered was presented to Warren Fishers' Carlisle Mercury.

## Tobacco spot checks Drug Abuse program

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has announced that it will sample Burley tobacco from the warehouse floor in the search of DDT or TDE. Tests run on the 1971 crop showed an alarming amount of DDT and TDE residue in the leaf. This high residue tobacco could be rejected by buyers.

During the past two years, practically all producers certified that they did not use materials containing DDT or TDE on their tobacco. However, chemical analysis of samples of the 1971 crop grown in some areas show residue levels of DDT or TDE which indicate that certifications made by some producers were false. As tobacco is mixed in the re-drying and packing processes,

most of the tobacco packed in an area may contain DDT or TDE residue even though the materials were used by only a few producers. Thus, a few producers using DDT or TDE can cause the lowest important markets. Several major buyers, both for domestic use and for export have indicated concern about the level of DDT or TDE residue in their purchases last year from certain areas. Some have indicated that they may reduce their purchases in those areas this year.

Chemical analyses will be made this year of samples taken on each market before the tobacco is mixed so that the producer of each lot tested can be identified. All Burley tobacco producers should consider
