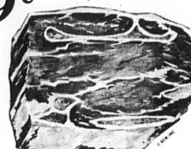

GET YOUR \$ WORTH BY SALLY AND JIM ADAMS. **CUT YOUR HEATING BILLS.** Last week we passed along expert recommendations concerning care of your furnace and thermostat in order to cut your fuel bills substantially. Now let's consider what else you can do to keep warm and in good air out. Your house should be as airtight as possible to prevent heat loss - which can be plenty. Heating engineers say that even a well-built and insulated house can leak as much air as if it has a foot-square hole in the wall. Storm doors and windows can cut heat loss by a good 10 per cent. They're fairly expensive to install, but what you save on fuel will pay for them in eight or 10 years. Seal off those places where air may be entering. Caulk around the frames of windows and doors, apply weatherstripping at movable joints. Large cracks can be sealed with insulating material and sealed with caulking compound; smaller cracks can be made airtight with putty. If you have a hot water system, check to make sure the radiators are heating all the way across. If not, open the vent at the top and purge the excess air. When dust collects on register fins, convectors and baseboard units, you lose heat, so vacuum them at least once a year. Keep furniture and draperies clear of radiators so that air can circulate freely. Utilize sunshine - it's free. Pull back drapes and raise blinds on the sunny side of the house and give the furnace a rest. Conversely, pull drapes at night to keep the heat in. If you have a fireplace, be sure to keep the damper closed except when you have a fire going. If the furnace suddenly goes off, don't rush to call a serviceman until you've checked these possibilities: the thermostat may have been turned down, the main fuse of the one controlling the burner may have blown; filters on a forced air system may need cleaning. Also, the oil supply may have run out - a team system may need water; the pilot light on a gas furnace may have gone out.

FASHION 'N FABRICS By FANNIE GLEESON. SECRETS OF SLACKS THAT FIT. Mrs. C.H.S. Donald says, "I want more facts on fitting slacks. She also says: "Are pants good fashion, especially for the plumper person?" Black slacks are in, and they can be slimming, as well as fashionable. The girl or woman who has shied away from slacks will find that well-cut, properly fitting, wide-legged pants help to camouflage curves. A tonic top adds to the pleasing effect of length. Be sure the tunic is long enough, extending well below the darts. For ease of wear, buy the right size slacks. Be guided by the hip measurement, which is taken seven inches above the waist. Make your size and slacks in muslin, then use it as a basic for all types. Before making the sample, slacks in the tissue pattern. Draw a horizontal line seven inches below the waistline. The length of this line should equal your hip measurement plus two inches for ease. If it is less, slash the pattern vertically from waist to hem and spread out over paper to the amount needed. Tape pattern and paper. If more, take a tack in the pattern. When your waistline measures more than the pattern, divide the additional amount needed by four. Add one-quarter to each strip in the front and back pattern sections. Taper to the crotch, stopping short of the hipline. To decrease waist, trim the pattern at center and side seams. If you are swayback, slacks may ripple below the back waistline. Cut across the hipline horizontally, from the center seam close to the side seam, approximately three and a half inches below the waistline. Lap the cut edges the required amount. Redraw the side seam to conform to the amount lost at the waistline. Accommodating a protruding tummy also requires a little sleight-of-hand. It will not accomplish anything just to add to the side seams. You still only have waistline to lose. The procedure is to cut through the center of the waistline dart, vertically, and spread the dart. Then, draw a horizontal line from the side seam to the side seam, three inches below the waistline. Spread from the center seam to create a wedge-shaped area. Tape tissue pattern to paper drawing in the adjustment. Repeat waistline dart in the normal position. This adjustment has given you more length and grain in the area from the waist to crotch. When slacks ripple under the seat, the fabric is being stretched by the darts. To correct this, make the waistline darts wider and deeper. Move the base of the darts by adding to the side seams, approx. to the hipline. If still more sitting space is needed, add to the inside of the leg seam on the back section of the pattern. Take time to get a perfect fit and you'll enjoy your slacks that much more. They go all out with luxurious velvet as a beautiful choice for the evening season illustrated. For more casual wear, shorten the tunic and use fabric with a little more body, such as velveteen.
