Kay's Kitchen

HOLIDAY SALADS

These salads all go well with turkey, either hot or cold. They may take a little more time and trouble but most of them can be made ahead of time, thus saving time when you are having company, or are getting dinner ready to serve. They are also really in case of emergency guests.

GRAPEFRUIT SALAD

Dissolve 2 packages of gelatin in 1/2 cup hot water. Cool in jelly in half and then add pulp and juice to make 3/4 cups. If necessary add water to make necessary amount. Add juice and pulp to jelly mixture and pour into grapefruit halves to cogel in refrigerator.

MOLDED CRANBERRY SALAD

1 package raspberry gelatin
1 1/2 ounce package cream cheese
1 can whole cranberry sauce
1 cup chopped nuts
1 cup white seedless grapes
Fresh cranberries (use only one can)

Dissolve gelatin in 1 cup boiling water. Allow to cool partially. Mix in cream cheese, then add all other ingredients except cream. Whip cream and fold in last. This fills a 9 inch square pan and is rich enough to serve.

GINGER FRUIT SALAD

1 tablespoon gelatin
2 tablespoons cold water
1/2 cup boiling water
1 tablespoon sugar
dash of salt
2 tablespoons lemon juice
1 cup pineapple
Soften gelatin in cold water; add boiling water and stir until gelatin is dissolved. Add sugar, salt, ginger and lemon juice; chill. When slightly thickened, fold in 1/2 cup heavy whipping cream, 1/2 cup sliced and washed grapes, 1/2 cup dried cranberries, 1/2 cup chopped pineapple, 3/4 tablespoons chopped crystallized ginger or preserved ginger, 1/2 cup chopped pecans. Pour into mold and chill until set.

SPICED PEACH CUPS

1 No. 2 1/2 can sliced peaches
1 tablespoon vinegar
1 teaspoon whole cloves
1/2 inch stick cinnamon
1 package orange marmalade
Combine spears and drained peach juice, bring to a boil and boil about five minutes. Cover and let stand about 30 minutes. Dissolve gelatin in 1 cup boiling water, add 1 cup hot spiced liquid, strained. If you want the salad to be spicier use all the spiced juice and enough water to make 2 cups. It will find most people like the salad spicier. Chill until firm.

PARTY SALAD

2 packages cherry gelatin
1 cup hot water or fruit juice
1 No. 2 can sliced black King cherries
1 No. 2 can crushed pineapple
1 cup nuts, your choice
1 teaspoon lemon juice
dash of salt

Mix jelly in hot water or fruit juice.
