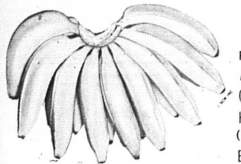

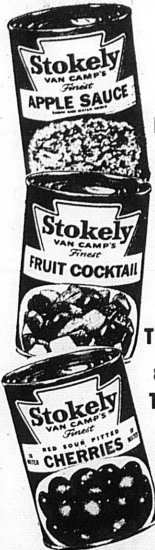

Proclamation

BY THE
Governor

To All To Whom These Presents Shall Come:

WHEREAS, Newspapers provide an opportunity to focus attention on the fundamental importance of the First Amendment; and
WHEREAS, The newspaper medium is regarded as a forum for the free exchange of ideas and opinions, as well as the means of factually reporting events; and
WHEREAS, Newspapers stress the essential role of community service and vital contributions to the social, religious, educational, and economic lives of their communities; and
WHEREAS, The liberties exercised by the free press indeed belong to all the people; not singularly to the press; and
WHEREAS, Freedom of the press requires a responsible newspaper in its continuous efforts to improve its functions-as fact based on the public obligation realized due to its unique impact in molding opinion and stimulating reaction;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, WENDELL H. FORD, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, do hereby proclaim the week of October 8 - 14, 1972, as
NEWSPAPER WEEK
in Kentucky, and urge all citizens of the Commonwealth to join in this observance.

Done in the City of Frankfort, this 13th day of September, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred Seventy-two and in the year of the Commonwealth the One Hundred Eighty-first.

Have You Registered To Vote? You have until October 10, 1972, to check up on your status as a voter. If you've never registered to vote in Kentucky, or if you've moved out of the precinct where you were registered before, if you've changed your name or if you haven't voted recently, stop by the County Court Clerk's office as soon as possible. October 10 is the deadline for Kentuckians to register to vote in the November election.

Any U.S. citizen 18 years of age or older, who has lived in the state, county and precinct at least 30 days before an election, is eligible to vote in that election. These new residency requirements resulted from recent Supreme Court rulings and laws passed at a special session of the Kentucky Legislature.

If you have changed your name by marriage or otherwise, you must re-register. And if you've previously registered but have failed to vote for the past two years, you must re-register in order to vote in the November election.

If you will be away from home on Election Day, you may apply for an absentee ballot. An application for such a ballot must be requested from the County Clerk. The application should be returned (signed by the absentee voter and sworn before a notary public) to the County Clerk seven days before the election. The absentee ballot itself must be received by the County Clerk in time to be counted at the close of the polls on Election Day.

If you have changed your address within the same county, the address change can take place by mail if the statement is signed by all the voters in your family to whom the address change applies.

Students have two options open as to registration. If they wish to vote in the precinct of their parent's home, they may file an absentee ballot. If they cannot come home to vote. However, students can register at home in the state, county and precinct where they are attending school if they are living there at least 30 days before the election.

Toll Free Telephone

The Marine Corps Recruiting Station at Louisville has recently installed a toll free telephone as a public service to the young men and women of Kentucky.

The phone, now in use, is intended to simplify the efforts of anyone in Kentucky desiring information about enlisting in the United States Marine Corps.

Dialing 1-800-292-5562 will put the caller in contact with the main recruiting station which will, in turn, contact the nearest Marine recruiter for further assistance to the person calling.
