Contest seeks Ky.'s top 4-H Club members

Ten Kentucky 4-H club members will share \$1,800 in U. S. Savings Bonds in the 1972 4-H Club Award of Excellence Program sponsored by The Courier-Journal and The Louisville Times.

An annual public service program of the Louisville newspapers, the program is in cooperation with the University of Kentucky Agricultural Extension Service which assisted in its development and whose extension agents coordinate it.

The participants who are selected the top 4-H club boy and girl in the state will each receive a \$500 U. S. Savings Bond. Eight runners-up—four girls and four boys—will each receive a \$100 bond.

All 10 winners and their parents will receive all-expense-paid trips to Louisville to be guests of honor at the Annual Farm Awards Luncheon in February, 1973.

In addition to the top 10 award, award of excellence plaques will be awarded to the outstanding 4-H club boy and girl in each county having 10 or more participants—five girls and five boys—in the program.

Certificates of merit will be awarded to the top boy and girl in each of the three competition age groups in each county. The age groups are 9-12, 13-15, and 16-19 for both boys and girls.

Participants in the program will be judged on their individual academic development, moral development, civic and community development, physical development, and participation in 4-H club activities. Judging will take place on November 1, 1972, at the University of Kentucky, Lexington.
