

Sorghum Festival to be held in West Liberty

WEST LIBERTY, Ky.—Here and there in Morgan County cane mills already are in operation, boiling green cane juice into thick golden amber syrup to be sold at the second annual Morgan County Sorghum Festival in West Liberty, Oct. 13-14.

The festival has a delectable excitement this year. It signals the start of Morgan County's year-long festal celebration which will culminate with 1973 festival.

Highlights of the festival will include a multi-powered case mill located on Main Street, where everyone will have the opportunity to "dip" in cane stalk and taste the sweet nectar that was known as "long sweetener" to earlier generations. Sorghum will be sold by the gallon, plenty to last all winter even if poured over hot biscuits every day, fried in a skillet or used in cakes, pies and cookies.

In addition to many arts, crafts and other entertainment, including a Saturday parade, the event will see the opening of Town Cinema on Main Street, a section that was burned out in a 1970 fire, and the release of the county's first book-size history.

Edgar Tolson of Campton, pop-

ular wood sculptor plans to exhibit at the festival as do many Central and Eastern Kentucky artists.

All art and crafts booths and food booths will be located on Main Street beneath a 240-foot circus tent, suspended from light pole to light pole.

Under the big top, Morgan County will demonstrate weaving on both an looke-bloom and larger loom, spinning on a flax wheel, rope making, grist mill grinding, whitening, single spinning with a mallet and frow, pottery making with a handmade potter's wheel, jewelry making, chair casting with black-ory strips, quilting, basket and broom making and hand tanning.

Products from the demonstrations will be for sale, as will corn-shuck dolls and flowers, homemade bonnets, furniture, wood carvings, tree soap, antiques, original art, dulcimers and other traditional crafts of hill people.

One concession stand will offer a country dinner of soup beans, cornbread, molasses gingerbread and coffee; another Bryce souvenir jug filled with Morgan-Made Molas is a fine other booth will sell pickled apples, saupured apples, pickled beets

and corn, shuck beans, cornob and old-time preserves.

A country store will sell everything from pumpkins and cushaws to plug tobacco and calico. There will be a patchwork quilt and crocheted afghans, quilt-piece cushion covers and coverlets.

The festival queen will be named during a Friday night folk music session on the courthouse square and square dancing will be enjoyed both Friday and Saturday nights.

Among folk artists who will attend the festival are Lily Mae of the original Coon Creek Circle,

Hubert Rogers, Frank Baker and his wife Edna Ritchie Baker with their dulcimers and ballads. Mrs. Baker is a sister of Jean Ritchie, both natives of Viper, Ky.

Events of the sorghum festival will take place next to the Morgan County courthouse.

Morgan Countyans already are sporting beards and wearing bonnets as part of the county's 150th birthday. The Sociocultural starts this year and will continue throughout the month until the next festival. Morgan County joined the Commonwealth in 1823.

Feeder Calf Assoc. rules listed

The following are rules and regulations of the Central Kentucky Feeder Calf Sales to be held at the Paris Stockyards. The sales are sponsored by the Bourbon County Livestock Improvement Association, under the Rules and Regulations established by the Kentucky Feeder Calf Association. Sale Dates—Wednesday, Oct. 4,

7:30 p.m. EDT (our time) Wednesday, Nov. 1, 7:30 p.m. EST (our time). Receiving Cattle: Cattle will be received the day of the sales with the scale opening at 7:00 a.m. and closing 3:00 p.m.

All calves must be owned for 60 days by the consignor.

All calves will be graded, marked and penned according to weight, breed, sex, and grade. No private pens—all cattle are graded. Producers are advised and urged to castrate early and properly, preferably with knives. No tag-gy calves will be accepted. Out-gy calves sold after sale will be sold separate from pooled and unbranded calves. Producers are advised and urged to dehorn at a sale. Calves over 400 lbs. will also be sold separate.

Calves with eye lesions, bad eyes or pink eye, lame, sick, or unthrifty calves will be considered out calves. They will be sold after the sale.

Cross bred calves will be accepted. They will be separated into grades of cross breeds of their type.

All calves will be vaccinated against Blackleg and Malpignant Edema at the stockyard by accredited veterinarians according to the regulations established by the state association.

Any club calves sold will be accepted with the consignor's consent by the local committee after grading.
