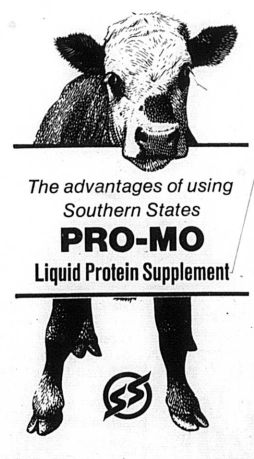

Another Olympics is on the way

Physically handicapped children and their parents around the state should circle Sept. 15-16 on their calendars. Those are the dates for the 1972 Kentucky Olympics for the Physically Handicapped, held in Louisville.

On Sept. 15th, the swimming competition will be held at the Central High School pool (1130 West Chestnut, Sun Valley Community Center). Bethany Lane will boat the track and field events on Sept. 16th.

There will be five separate swimming events and 15 track and field events designed to allow the greatest number of handicapped children to participate. Each child may enter three events.

The Kentucky Olympics for the Physically Handicapped are sponsored by the Metropolitan Park and Recreation Board, the Buech-

el-Fern Creek Jaycees and the Recreation for the Handicapped Committee.

Although handicapped children from all over Kentucky are welcome to compete, Mr. William L. Heath, recreation supervisor, expects most participants to come from the 19 counties around Louisville in the north-central Kentucky area. Overnight accommodations cannot be provided.

Handicapped children may enter by writing or calling Mrs. Nicki Spears, coordinator, Recreation

for the Handicapped Committee, Metropolitan Park and Recreation Board, P.O. Box 1334, Louisville, Kentucky 40213. Entrants may call (502) 454-0440.

The deadline for entry is September 13.

This year's Olympics will feature a parade to open the track and field competition. An awards luncheon will follow on Saturday. Each participant will receive a medal, and there will be trophies and ribbons for the victorious Olympians.
