### Dr. Sabie says, More girls needed as US Olympic Games participants

MOREHEAD—"American girls should be encouraged to participate more in volleyball, gymnastics, and track and field events," Dr. Sabie said.

Speaking at the annual meeting of the Division of Consumer Protection in Paris last week, Dr. Sabie said he is pleased to see that the Division of Consumer Protection is being organized to improve a direct line for complaints.

A spokesman for the Attorney General said hotline calls are averaging about 10 to 15 per day. The nature of calls vary, but the three most frequent complaints concern home collection sales, free-trip circulars and "free" samples that aren't really what they advertise.

All complaints are logged for future reference or investigation. So far, the division has settled several complaints by entering one-law-the-three-day cooling-off period statute.

Under the 1972 consumer protection law, a consumer can cancel a sales contract solicited in his home if he acts within three business days from the date of the contract signing.

Kentucky is the only state in the nation to include a consumer hotline and is considered first in handling complaints.

### National PTA 75th anniversary commemorated by new stamp

A commemorative stamp marking the 75th anniversary of the National Parent-Teacher Association is now on sale in Kentucky's post offices.

The stamp officially went on sale Saturday following national ceremonies in Washington, D.C.

Mrs. George White, Covington, Kentucky's PTA president, was the first to purchase the stamp in the state in ceremonies in Frankfort. Ceremonies were also held last weekend in each of the state's fourteen PTA districts.

Mrs. White will present sheets of the stamps to Governor Wendell Ford, Lyman W. Ginger, Superintendent of Public Instruction; Samuel Alexander, Deputy Superintendent; and to the Kentucky Historical Society.

Mrs. White will present the stamps to Mrs. White, Hugh Moore, Jr., Officer in Charge, Frankfort Post Office. She pointed out that the first 50 million stamps released have inverted numbers on the sheets. The error was detected by engravers but they decided not to recall the stamps. This feature does not make the stamp more valuable but it

### In Service

The State Department of Agriculture has cancelled the Central Kentucky Barrow Show which was to have been held at Campbellsville on Oct. 4.

This action was taken due to the hog cholera outbreak which has occurred in Kentucky. Although the outbreak is now under control, it was felt that it might be better to delay the barrow show.

The show has been rescheduled for March 26, 1973. This will enable producers to have sufficient time to select and prepare entries for the annual show.

As for the cholera problem, we are pleased with the cooperation which we have received from all those involved—farmers, truckers, etc. One problem which has been encountered has involved the feeding of pork scraps to dogs.

Two incidents of cholera have been traced to meat scraps as being the source of infection. Pork bones and meat trimmings, containing the cholera virus, were fed to dogs which evidently carried some of the scraps into areas occupied by hogs.

The hog cholera virus does not present a health hazard to humans. However, the message we want to get out is that the virus can live for considerable time in pork meat. Consequently, bones or trimmings contaminated with the virus can infect hogs exposed to them.

The ban on the movement of market hogs has been lifted and the ban on the movement of feeder pigs is to be lifted September 25. There are some restrictions on moving slaughter-hogs from farms where a quarantine has been in effect. These hogs must move under permit from livestock health officials.

While we have some questions regarding our feeder pig market after the movement has been lifted, the overall picture looks good. As

### COMMISSIONER BUTLER LOOKS AT Agriculture

It looks now, it will be only a short time until our entire industry is back to normal marketing procedures.

Thistle Infestation can be a serious problem for landowners, but thistles can be controlled with proper treatment and timely cultural practices. However, apathy on the part of some landowners is resulting in the spread of these noxious weeds despite the control efforts of others.

The Division also sprays for thistles—nodding, Canadian, and bull thistles. For the three, nodding thistle is the most common in Kentucky, with a sizable acreage being infested with the bull thistle.

During this past season—which is the early spring months—the Division sprayed 4,000 acres in 10 counties for thistle control. This program is operated like the Johnson grass program, in that the farmer provides the chemical and the Division the necessary equipment and personnel.

Noxious Weed Program covers some 9,000 acres. The Department of Agriculture's Division of Pest & Noxious Weed Control has completed its spraying season for Johnson grass control. This year, some 4,500 acres infested with Johnson grass were sprayed in 37 counties. Of this amount, 3,800 acres involved custom spraying for farmers participating in the control program. The remaining 700 acres represented demonstration plots.

The custom spraying is coordinated by local agricultural officials and involves spraying infested land for farmers who have requested this service. The farmer provides the chemical necessary to treat his land. The Pest Control Division provides the spray equipment and personnel. Farmers participating in the program are asked to follow the initial treatment with cultural practices that are essential in a weed control program. In addition to custom spraying, the Division conducts demonstration plots in the counties where
