According to John Alden, Director of Information and Research for the Department of Public Administration, tours of the Capital Plaza facilities are given Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. The tours start from the fountain in the center of the plaza and include the agriculture center, plaza tower and other points of interest.  
"We believe that the Capital Plaza will now take its place as a Frankfort landmark worthy of tourist attention," said Alden. "It is a new attraction in which Kentucky school children and

tourists alike can take great pride."  
Tours of the Capital Plaza are held seven days a week, Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., weekends, 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.  
The Governor's Mansion is open to visitors Tuesday and Thursday mornings, 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m., and the Lt. Governor's Mansion is open weekdays 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.  
Other points of interest for the Frankfort visitor include a walking tour of old Frankfort to see famous sites such as the site of the first log cabin in Frankfort, built around 1786, and the famed "Corner of Celebrities" where it is believed more famous men lived in four

### Political signs

Transportation Secretary Elijah M. Hoge, Frankfort, warned that any political signs placed on state-owned right-of-way will be removed by highway maintenance workers.  
The Secretary said, "Placing any advertising device—business as well as political—on the Commonwealth's roadside is forbidden by the statutes. In the case of certain Interstate and Primary roads, federal regulations also are involved."  
He continued, "I am calling attention to political signs at this time because they are apt to become particular problems as the May primaries draw near."  
County offices in Kentucky are to be filled by this year's elections. Party primaries often attract a substantial number of candidates and their campaign material generally includes banners, stickers and posters. In the past roadides have often been used to display their advertising.  
"In the interest of highway safety, as well as beauty of our roadides, I have asked Highway Commissioner James E. Gray to direct an aggressive campaign for removal of these signs whenever they are found on state-maintained right-of-way," Hoge said.  
He stated that enforcement will be even-handed. It will not be directed against a particular party or set of candidates.  
"Of course it would be best if the candidates and their supporters did not post their signs on the Commonwealth's roadides in the first place," Hoge concluded. "I appeal to them to find other means of promoting their candidates."
