

Licking Valley C.A.P. back in business

The Licking Valley Community Action Program, which was to be phased out on July 31, 1972 received a reprieve Wednesday from Federal Court Judge William B. Jones. Judge Jones ordered acting O.E.D. Director, Howard Phillips to halt his action to terminate L.V.C.A.P. immediately because the activities were "sanctioned by law."

James M. Perkins, Executive Director of Licking Valley C.A.P., Inc., said staff were overjoyed with receiving word of the court's decision. Mr. Perkins stated that "now we can get back to the business at hand, to aid the poor, elderly, unemployed and the disadvantaged youth of our eight counties."

Those programs that would be affected by termination of Licking Valley C.A.P., Inc. are Meals on Wheels, Job Option, Community Mainstream, Head Start, Youth Clothing Bank, Neighborhood Youth Corps, Home a Kid, Economic Development, Family Planning, and Senior Services.

Mr. Perkins further stated that Licking Valley C.A.P. has been responsible for the following programs:

• Mrs. Brenda Carpenter, Director of Job Option Program, states that more than 400 disadvantaged persons have been placed on the job and trained, which a large percentage are still engaged and paying taxes, instead of receiving them.

• Mrs. Eleanor Taylor, Head Start Director, states Head Start has been in operation for seven years and approximately 2500 children in Licking Valley have been served. Head Start is based on the premise that all children share certain needs, and that children from low-income families, in particular, can benefit from a Comprehensive Developmental Program to meet those needs. The family, which is the principal focus of the child's development, must be a direct participant in the program.

• Community Mainstream, Head Start, try, Clothing Bank, Neighborhood Youth Corps, Home a Kid, Economic Development, Family Planning, and Senior Services.

decline in the importance of Congress versus the executive branch. Congress must have the authority to check and balance the executive branch in the formation and enactment of national policy.

One of the biggest shocks I encountered when entering the Senate was the appalling lack of space and facilities which I had in my office. There are many of you who doubtless had stories about the "magnificent splendor" of a Senator's office and allegedly large sums of money available for Senators to spend as they please.

Let me set the record straight—that simply is not the case. Head Start program, for example, in almost any Senator's office, you will find four or five staff members, stenographers, each room—often with file cabinets and office machines jammed around it.

And while each Senator is allotted a certain amount of money for his office, it actually only adequate. When I took office, I had a staff of 10. In my office, it becomes almost impossible to concentrate. This is the condition under which top legislative personnel on the Hill must work, and that simply is not desirable.

Another shortcoming is the fact that many of our Senators are not adequately informed on the issues that they are handling. Many involve reporters, who have particular areas or subjects they are interested in, and still others are merely viewing their Senators about pressing national issues.
