Wildlife Sanctuary is center of study

Stop the bluffs of the Kentucky River in northwest Woodford county, is the Clyde E. Buckley Wildlife Sanctuary—235 acres of wooded hill country and open fields.

Such in native plants and wildlife, the sanctuary is considered to be one of the best in the state for the study of the natural environment and serve as a center for study.

Operated by the National Audubon Society, on land donated by Mrs. Clyde E. Buckley of Lexington, as a memorial to her late husband, this wildlife refuge is one of the few Audubon Society sanctuaries located in the interior of the United States.

Points of interest in the sanctuary include the Marion E. Lindsey Birdwatching House—an all-weather, glass-enclosed observation building near bird feeders; the nature center, named after Kentucky wildlife artist and naturalist Howard Chandler Christy, and a bird-watching shelter overlooking Apollo Ford and its adjacent wetlands.

The sanctuary is open to the general public Saturday and Sunday afternoon, from 10 a. m. to 4 p. m., on Wednesday through Friday from 9 a. m. to 5 p. m., and on Saturday from 10 a. m. to 4 p. m., by reservation only, to groups of 10-30 persons. On Monday and Tuesday the sanctuary is closed.

The Clyde E. Buckley Wildlife Sanctuary is 15 miles west of Versailles on Highway US-560.
