

### Educators call on business for exploratory discussions

Kentucky educators have called for "exploratory discussions" with business leaders to determine if a joint effort to eliminate the "dropout from the Commonwealth" is possible through the Kentucky school system.

Dr. J. Marvin Dodson, executive secretary of the Kentucky Education Association, told directors of the Kentucky Council of Commerce that "almost a third of our high school students will not be around to receive their diplomas."

Yes, he said, the demand for unskilled labor is shrinking. "We no longer have the absorptive quality in the work force to take care of the mistakes we made in the educational system."

Realistic summaries point out that almost 10 per cent of Kentucky's adult population have less than five years of schooling and more than 10 per cent have less than a year of high school. "The time is long overdue that we work together," Dodson suggested. "We must stop wasting these lives and burdening our society with a handicap it cannot carry."

"Kentucky's schools are your business partners," he told the board. They are a "major force" in attracting new industry, they are the backbone of the state's tomorrow's work force and they represent a "natural ally" in achieving needed tax relief.

This "partnership" is suffering, he maintained, because of the failure to "underinvest" in its educational system. In current expenditure per pupil, the state ranks 41st in the nation, last among surrounding states and ninth among the 15 southeastern states.

"Just five years ago, our investment per pupil was 30 per cent below the national average," he said. "Today it is nearly 37 per cent."

He cited several studies summarized by a Tennessee Valley Authority report which suggested that "community schools" which fail to provide and maintain

### Commissioner announces insurance rate decrease for automobile drivers

Harold B. McGuffey, commissioner of insurance, today announced an insurance rate decrease that will save Kentucky automobile drivers approximately \$5 million during the policy year.

The Department of Insurance has approved an overall 10 percent decrease in private passenger automobile insurance rates for the Insurance Service Office (ISO) of Kentucky.

More than one-half of the automobile liability and medical payments coverage written in Kentucky is placed through companies who are affiliates of ISO.

In view of rising prices for many other products and services, it is a real hardship to announce that more than one-half of our Kentucky motorists are being provided with a significant reduction in car insurance premiums," McGuffey said.

The 10-percent decrease nearly doubles the decrease of 5.1 percent requested by the ISO in its initial application to the Department on Feb. 7. At that time, the commissioner rejected the proposal on grounds that the request failed to comply

### MSU to hold EMT classes Oct. 1-Jan. 10

MORHEAD, Ky.—Morhead State University is offering a new course for a federally-funded project to train emergency medical technicians.

The 10-week course is scheduled for the emergency medical center, which is located on the third year. Dates for the class at MSU will be Oct. 1 through Jan. 10.

Sponsored by the Kentucky Department of Health and Public Safety, the EMT training program is made possible through a grant from the U.S. Department of Transportation.

The course is designed for ambulance attendants, emergency room personnel, firemen, policemen, nurses, safety engineers, rescue squad and life squad members, police health and public health personnel. Registration is limited to 20 students per class. All registrants must be at least 18 years old.

EMT classes meet Mondays and Thursdays from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m. and once-a-week consecutive weeks. The 20 lessons involve 71 hours of classroom instruction, 10 hours of on-the-job observation.

Additional information and advance registration forms for the EMT courses may be obtained from Thomas A. Thompson, Training Director, Emergency Health Services, State Department of Health, 273 Commonwealth Street, Frankfort, Ky. 40601. A \$15 enrollment fee must be submitted with each application.

Use caution when someone offers guaranteed satisfaction, the guarantee may be worthless. Remember a guarantee is only as good as the person behind it. Never pay money in advance, or sign contracts with individuals that you have not checked out thoroughly. If you do happen to advance these person money, the work may drag on indefinitely. The materials you bought you paid for, may not be paid for at all. Your home represents a large investment, so it is better to be safe than sorry. The following are some hints to help you save your money and possibly the deterioration of your home.

Make sure you are dealing with a reputable person.

Don't let an individual talk you into any unnecessary repairs.

Never sign a contract without first getting at least one other estimate. Be cautious about extremely low bids. Remember to get all terms and agreements in writing.

Shop carefully.

And know the needs of your family and your property.

## Highway use tax is due, IRS says

LOUISVILLE, Ky.—Owners of large trucks, truck-trailers, or buses should file a federal highway use tax return. Form 750, by Aug. 31, Paul Niederreiter, District Director of Internal Revenue in Louisville, said today.

Revenue from the highway use tax assists states in financing the Interstate Highway System.

The amount of tax depends on a combination of the number of axles and weights of the vehicles. Generally, the tax applies to single unit trucks weighing 12,000 pounds or more, to truck-trailers weighing 5,000 pounds or more, to trucks of 1,000 pounds and over equipped for use in combinations and to buses with a gross weight in excess of 30,000 pounds.

The tax year begins July 1 and runs through the following of June 30. Subsequent returns may be necessary for vehicles in operation for the first time on public highways after July.

IRS Publication 86, "Federal Use Tax on Trucks, Truck-Trailers, and Buses," is available free of charge at district IRS offices, and provides further information on this subject.
