any farm for any year shall be increased by the number of pounds by which marketings from the farm during the preceding year were less than the farmer's poundage quota.

Likewise, he notes, any marketing in excess of a farmer's quota are deducted from the farmer's quota for the following year.  
Cook said the USDA currently anticipates undermarketing for the 1972 farm quotas to exceed overmarketing by 23 million pounds.  
36.6% of burley tobacco growers favored marketing quotas on their 1971, 1972 and 1973 crops in a vote taken in May, 1971.
