Kay's Kitchen

During the winter weeks ahead let's try serving vegetables a little differently. Experiment on your own, you may come up with something delicious.

Here are some that have been tried and are good. It is surprising what the addition of water chestnuts, mushrooms or nuts can do for what we think of just ordinary vegetables.

WILD RICE CASEROLE
This is particularly good to serve with the Christmas turkey when serving it sliced cold.

1 cup wild rice
1 can consommé
1 tablespoon butter or margarine
1/2 cup finely chopped celery
1/2 cup finely chopped onion

Wash rice. Put in casserole, add onion and celery. Add consommé and mix well. Cover and leave to soak for 3 hours. Soak mushrooms in water. Add to rice and bake an hour at 350 degrees, covered. Stir several times, if it becomes too dry add more consommé, or juice from canned mushrooms.

BRUSSEL SPROUTS
2 packages of frozen Brussels Sproouts, 10 oz. each
1/2 stick of butter
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup chopped pecans

2 packages of frozen Brussels Sproouts, 10 oz. each
1/2 stick of butter
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup chopped pecans

Cook sprouts according to package directions; drain and place in warm serving dish. In a small skillet melt butter over moderately low heat; add salt and pecans and stir until hot. Spoon evenly over sprouts. This dressing adds just the right vegetable and makes it something special.

FRUITED ACORN SQUASH
1/2 acorn squash per serving
Melted butter, salt, applesauce, minced. Add to squash, ham or beef



SWEET POTATOES WITH APPLESAUCE
2 1/2 cups cooked sweet potatoes, you can use canned, drained
1 cup applesauce
1/2 cup brown sugar, packed
1/2 cup quick cooking oatmeal
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
2 tablespoons margarine

Place potatoes in baking dish; Sprinkle with salt. Pour applesauce over potatoes. Dot generously with margarine. Mix brown sugar, oatmeal and cinnamon. Sprinkle mixture over all. Bake at 375 degrees for 30 minutes, until just browned.

SALAD DRESSING
4 cups sliced yellow onions
1 1/2 teaspoons salt
6 cups water
3 tablespoons butter
1 1/2 tablespoons flour
pepper

1 cup liquid from onions
1/2 cup vinegar
1/2 cup oil

Cook onions in salted water until tender. Drain, but save 1/2 cup liquid. Add butter, stir in flour and seasonings, add liquid and stir until thick. Add sauce to onions and pour the vinegar, oil and pepper over. Boiling; pour into casserole, top with lettuce crumble and bake at 350 degrees until well browned. This will serve about 10.

"Plans for the sale of the individual Kentucky medals will be announced later in 1972," Hellmann said.
