#### WHO PREPARES YOUR TAX RETURN?

Last week we talked about the highly trained tax consultants who will prepare your return for a fee. Certified Public accountants, lawyers specializing in tax matters, and "enrolled" tax positioners. You can also hire a "strategized" accountant. Many of these are completely trustworthy and competent. Having completed a course of training, and maintain high standards. The bookkeeping maintained at H & R Block, Inc., whose accountants have been given a training course; they guarantee to prepare accurate returns and will pay any interest or penalty charges caused by errors on their part.

If you're unlucky, you may find yourself dealing with what IRS calls "fly-by-night" tax return operators. These unscrupulous characters can usually be spotted by their refusal to sign the return they have prepared. Also, they generally do not maintain offices the year around; they disappear in April at the end of the tax season. Avoid these fellows like the plague.

If you go to a CPA or a tax lawyer, he prepared to pay a substantial fee for their help. You can deduct this fee from your income tax. Many charge an hourly rate of about \$70, which for a tax situation that's not too complicated breaks down to a fee of about \$25 for preparing a standard deduction Form 1040, about \$35 for an itemized deduction Form 1040. The office also does your deductions and income, the more you pay. Even a simple form takes work, and H & R Block, which advertises a low fee of \$5, averages about \$100 to \$11 per customer.

There's another source of help that won't cost you a cent—the IRS office. The IRS agent won't make out your form for you, but he'll help you all along the way. Tell you what's allowable and what isn't, explain the complex language of the forms. Remember, whoever does your return, that you have to provide him with the facts—income, exemptions, expenses. And if these facts are in error, you're responsible, not the accountant who prepares your return.

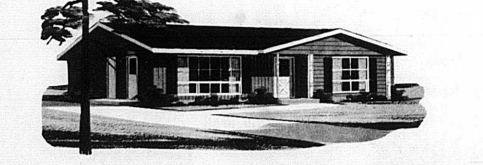

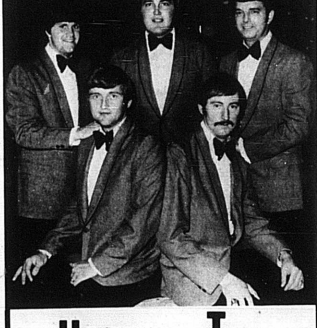
