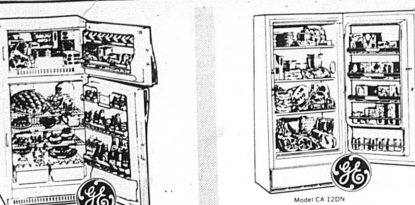

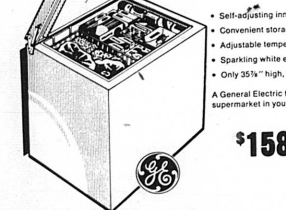

## Kay's Kitchen

No matter what the weather is like, we still have to eat—most of us three times a day. So I'll give you recipes I know are good. The week Helen was more excited to send me, I'll pass them on to you. They are varied: a salad, dessert, snack and a main dinner dish. Try them. I'm sure you will enjoy each one.

### VANILLA WAFFER CAKE

- 2 sticks of margarine
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1-12 ounce vanillin vanilla, crushed fine
- 1-7 ounce package extra fine coconut
- 1 cup chopped nuts
- 1 1/4 teaspoon vanilla
- Blend sugar and margarine, add eggs one at a time, beat well after each one.
- Add vanilla then milk, alternately with water crumb. Add coconut and nuts. Bake in tube pan at 1 hour at 300 degrees. Cool in pan before removing. Serve plain or with whipped cream.

### CANTALOUPE SALAD

- 1 box cantaloupe slices
- 1 cup bottled pineapple juice
- 1/2 cup cold pineapple juice
- Mix pineapple in bottled pineapple juice until dissolved, add cold juice.
- Wash and cut cantaloupe halves, cut in 1/2 inch cubes. (This is also good when drained fruit cocktail is added to the gelatin mixture. K.F.T.)

### SWISSI BROWNIES

- 2 cups sugar
- 1 tablespoon cocoa
- 2 sticks margarine
- 1/2 cups flour
- 2 teaspoons vanilla
- 4 eggs
- Mix sugar and cocoa, cream with margarine, add eggs, vanilla and flour.
- Add nuts or coconut if desired. Put in 8 1/2 pan and cook at 350 degrees for 25 minutes or until firm.

### HRUBARZ CAKE

- 1/2 cup all purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup margarine
- 1/2 cup firmly packed light brown sugar
- 1/2 cup butter or margarine, soft
- 1 cup sour cream
- 1 egg, beaten
- 4 cups fresh rhubarb cut into 1/2 inch slices.
- 1 cup sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
