

Applications for '74-75 Fulbright Grants at Western

The Carl P. Brown School of Western Kentucky University's Department of Foreign Languages and Fulbright Program Advisor, has announced that information and application forms for the 1974-75 school year are now available. They may be obtained from his office in Room 251 of the Ivan Wilson Center for Fine Arts at the campus.

Fulbright grants are primarily for study and research and for professional training in the creative and performing arts, says Dr. Brown, and according to an announcement issued by the Institute of International Education, it is expected that approximately 550 awards to 45 countries will be available.

1973-74 school year and will study in Göttingen, Germany this fall. Selection for the grants is based on the academic and/or professional record of applicants, proposed study plan, language preparation, and personal qualifications.

Fulbright grants, whose purpose is to increase mutual understanding between the people of the U.S. and other countries through the exchange of persons, knowledge and skills, are provided under the terms of the Fulbright-Hays Act of 1961 and by foreign governments, universities, and private donors.
