Cook named floor leader Warrants charge 3 in beating on election reform bill

Because of his position as ranking minority member of the Senate Committee on Rules and Administration, Senator Marlow Cook was named, on June 19 to be assidant floor manager for elections. Although Senator Cook has expressed his support for the measure, S. 341, he announced that he would introduce an amendment to condense the election time announced that has the light presently provides. states where winter weather arrives early a better opportunity to reach polling places. Specifically, S. 343 would move the federal election day to the first Tuesday in October, require that primary elections be held no earlier than June 1, and allow national nominating conventions only during the menth of August. Cook's amendment to the bill would change the restriction on primaries from June 1 to July 1, thereby cutting another month off the election time. Cook has gone on record in favor of reducing campaign times because of the high cost, the possibility of abuse, and the bombardment of the public with politics for a long period. even further than that our preservi-provides.
