YOU AND THE DRAFT

Male Kentuckians born in 1954 will receive their "draft lottery" number from a drawing which will be held on Mar. 8, 1973, in Washington, D.C. Those receiving a "lottery" number from this drawing will be potentially vulnerable for induction for the entire calendar year 1974.

The Secretary of Defense has announced that there will be no requirement for draft calls in the first six months of 1973, and the administration has said that an extension of the draft induction authority will not be requested from Congress. Without this authority, the President cannot order a general induction. In order to restore draft calls in the event of emergency the induction authority would have to be restored by legislative action.

If the authority were to be restored during calendar year 1974 the young men who receive "lottery" numbers from the Mar. 8 drawing would be the prime

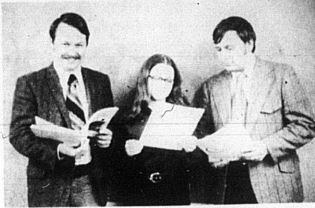
"draft" candidates.

This is the last time we can give this word of warning to the young men born in 1954. If you have not determined that the "draft" board has your correct date of birth on file, do so on or before Mar. 7. "Draft" regulations prohibit the changing of an incorrect birthdate on the individual's official record after the lottery.

We have emphasized this fact several times, however, from past experience we know that some young men are dilatory in acting.

It is our earnest desire that there will not be any post-lottery "Johnny Come Lately" simply because of lack of information regarding when the draft board is permitted to correct an error in date of birth.

Finally, young men still have legal obligations under the draft law. The 1964 year group, in particular, observes to know how the system will affect it, because it is the first to face eligibility during the standby draft.

Pre-Fabs, mobile homes the same

A ruling by the Department of Motor Transportation has placed prefab buildings and mobile homes in the same category of transporting purposes.

The issue resulted from an application by Morgan Drive Away, Inc. of Elkhart, Ind. seeking a certificate for transportation of buildings, intact or in sections.

"Whenever a new commodity appears, there is always the problem of defining whether the commodity should be transported under existing authority or whether it should be the subject of a new grant of authority and new certificate," Commissioner E.M. Hogg said in his order.

Since modular units have more of the characteristics of "house trailers" than of "buildings, intact or in sections," the order said that firms equipped and verified to transport mobile homes would be authorized to handle modular units.
