How good is BCG vaccine for treating cancer? - P.M. Presently, BCG vaccine has had only partial success in the treatment of cancer. This success has been with skin cancer, the most curable type of cancer. It is unfortunate that more progress has not been made in controlling this disease. Do not overreact to hope-baiting, but do give up hoping.

Could you please tell me what causes me to be so tired? I take blood pressure pills and have to force myself to do housework. Could you advise if there are certain foods which I should eat to gain some strength? - Mrs. A.B.W.

Food is not the answer. Many blood pressure pills cause you your present symptoms. Your doctor may want to adjust your dosage or change to another medication. If the medication isn't the cause of your tiredness, then it's something else which obviously needs attention. If I were you, I would see him soon.

Kay's Kitchen

When meal preparation time is limited, main dishes that are quick and easy come in handy.

For example, this one-dish, all-in-one meal, Noodle On Carne, cooks in about 20 minutes. After the meat is lightly browned, all ingredients are added to brew. The dry noodles cook quickly and tender in tomato juice.

To complete the main part of the meal, serve with a green salad and bread. With everything cooked in one dish, cleanup is a breeze.

NOODLE ON CARNE
1 pound lean ground beef
1 medium onion, sliced
1 1/2 pound can kidney beans, drained
4 ounces dry thin noodles
1 1/2 pound (3 1/2 ounce) 1% fat can whole tomatoes, chopped
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
1/2 cup chopped onion
1/2 cup margarine or butter
1/2 cup grated cheddar cheese
2 eggs
2 cups milk
1/2 teaspoon seasoned salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
