Rev. H. Dallas Sugg reports on Recreation Park progress

This report was submitted by Rev. H. Dallas Sugg, treasurer of the park board. The contract to surface the tennis court, multi-purpose area and parking area of the park has been awarded to Hinkle Construction Company of Paris for \$820. Two-inch compact bitlop will be used.

The Nicholas County Park and Recreation Board has announced that progress is being made in work at the Recreation Park. The most immediate plans are getting the multi-purpose court and tennis court paved.

Another project for this summer is the employment of a director for the project. The board hopes to cooperate with the university programs whereby a young person who is enrolled in some college-connected program will be employed for the summer.

To date there have been cash contributions in the amount of \$13,418.39. These contributions have come from individuals, businesses, industries, and civic organizations in Carlisle and Nicholas County.

back in Nicholas County from the BOR Grant has been in the amount of \$9,739.94. The third billing, which was recently mailed to Frankfort, will be processed and sent to Atlanta, Ga. The amount expected from this billing will total \$14,300. This amount plus the other amounts already received will total \$23,850.00. To date the Recreation Board has realized approximately one half of the total amount allocated.

In addition to these cash contributions, there have been contributions by individuals. The City of Carlisle, Kentucky National Guard, and Nicholas County Fiscal Court in the form of labor and equipment usage.

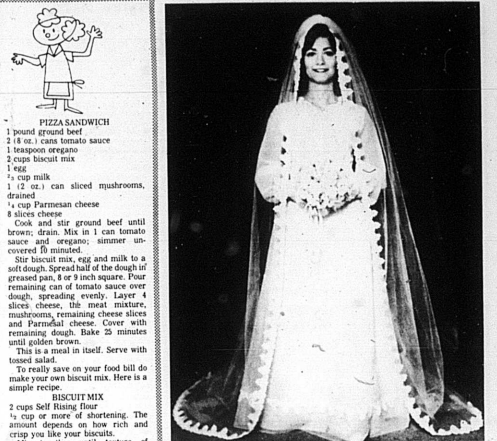
Kay's Kitchen

Here we are still trying to stretch the food dollar, and the best way to do so is to prepare breads, cakes and desserts. These come up not only easy but also cheap. Here are a few recipes that you can use up with using your own basic recipe. For the following recipes, use your own biscuit recipe up to the point where you add 1 cup crumbled French fried onions.

NUZ-BREAD
2 cups biscuit mix, 1 cup all purpose flour, 1 cup milk, 1 cup chopped nuts. Combine all ingredients, beat for about 1 minute. Pour into greased and floured loaf pan. Let stand about 30 minutes, then bake 30-35 minutes.

CINNAMON-NUT COFFEE CAKE
1 1/2 cups biscuit mix, 2 tablespoons sugar, 1 egg, 1/2 cup water, 1/2 cup evaporated milk. Combine all ingredients and beat 1 minute. Spread into greased 8" x 8" pan. Top with 1/2 cup of biscuit mix, 1/2 cup brown sugar, 1/2 cup cinnamon, 2 tablespoons margarine.

Piano recital planned June 4

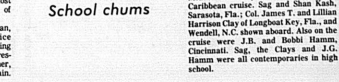
