LVCAC receives \$30,000 grant
Senator Marlow Cook has reported grants totaling \$1,149,010 were approved Nov. 12 in Washington, D.C., for Kentucky community action organizations, including one which serves this county.

Cook said the money was approved for a three-month period beginning Dec. 1. Most of the grants, the Senator added, are to go toward administering the local agencies and their ongoing programs, such as job training and placement, child day-care, summer lunch programs, and coordination of social and health services.

The local grant was \$30,000 to the Licking Valley Community Action Council, for Bath, Bracken, Fleming, Mason, Mendon, Montgomery, Nicholas and Robertson counties.
