# Kay's Kitchen

Start thinking about Christmas candies and have all ingredients on hand for that day when you are in the mood for candy making. Too, some candy is best made on a clear, sunny day. Make enough for your family, some to send to a neighbor, and don't forget the small visitors that are sure to visit during the holidays.

In the spring Mrs. V. Forke of Valley Station sent the basic FONDANT recipe. This is one candy you can make now whenever needed. I will give it just as she sent it to me.

**BASIC FONDANT CANDY**  
6 cups sugar  
2 cups water  
1 tablespoon white corn syrup, or pinch of cream of tartar

Place sugar and water in large sauce pan and heat until sugar is completely dissolved. Wear inside down of pan with damp cloth. When syrup boils add cream of tartar. Continue to boil, do not stir. Bring to 240 degree temperature or soft ball stage in candy thermometer, remove from heat at once. Let stand about 4 minutes or until air bubbles disappear, now pour into a large drop platter or marble slab. Sprung should be only 1/2 inch thick. Put in a cool place until lukewarm then beat with wooden spoon. Turn sugar backward and forward being unworked. Whole mass will become very smooth and shiny. Turn out from lumps. Wet and wring out a small towel and place over Fondant for 1 hour. This is the curing process. Remove cloth and knead as bread dough until creamy and smooth. Knead in air tight jar. Suggested flavorings for basic fondant: peppermint, vanilla, almond and cinnamon. Any color may be used. When getting ready to use, knead with 1 cup fondant in a double boiler or dish in a pan of water heated to boiling. Stir until mixture is cold and favoring. Stir in as little as possible. Nuts and coconut may also be added to basic fondant. If more

### CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIE FUDGE

2 tablespoons instant coffee  
3 cup evaporated milk  
1 cup milk  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
1/4 cup chopped nut meats  
1/4 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips

### MASHED POTATO CANDY

1/4 cup mashed potatoes  
1 lb. powdered sugar  
1/4 cup peanut butter  
Mix warm mashed potatoes with sifted sugar. Roll out in an oblong shape and spread with peanut butter. Roll up like jelly roll and cut into slices.

### SWEDISH NUTS

1 1/2 cups blanched almonds, 2 cups walnuts, 1 cup sugar, dash salt, 2 cups white and 1 cup butter.  
Toast nuts in 325 degree oven until brown. Fold sugar and salt in egg whites. Beat until stiff and fold in nuts. Melt butter in 2 jelly roll pans. Spread nuts over butter and bake 225 degrees 30 minutes, and stirring remain 10 minutes. until nuts are cooked with a brown color and no butter remains. Cool. Store in tin.
