SS new program effective Jan. 1

Supplemental Security Income is a new program that will go into effect Jan. 1, 1974, but you don't have to wait until then to file your application. In fact, if you're age 65, blind, or disabled, now is the time to file according to Ed Byrnes, manager of the Social Security office here.

He said his office is encouraging folks who feel they might qualify to file now "now" at the year-end rush. However, not everyone who meets the age, blind, or disabled definition is going to be eligible for these new benefits. Only those who meet the income and resource requirements are eligible.
