Safety training courses to be held

The Department of Fish and Wildlife's Division of Conservation Education will conduct three N.R.A. Hunter Safety Instructor training courses the latter part of September and one will be held in October. Those who successfully complete the course will become "teachers of teachers." That is, they will qualify to teach the practice of safe gun use in all hunter safety programs and to other adults who will in turn become instructors.

The course will be held at three locations around the state on Saturday, Sept. 29, according to James Gilpin, director of the Division of Conservation Education and coordinator of Kentucky's Hunter Safety training program.

The training workshops will be held at Camp John W. Curry on Kentucky Lake, Camp Earl Wallace on Lake Cumberland, and Camp Robert C. Webb on Grayson Reservoir in Carter county.

Gilpin notes that the all-day program is open to all interested adults over 21 years of age. There is no charge for the workshop, except for lunch.

The instructor training course will feature demonstrations in safe gun use, courses in hunter safety, and firing and testing of various firearms. Participants in the course will take an exam at the end of the session. Upon successful completion of the exam, the participants will receive certificates of participation, Hunter Safety Instructor card and bracelets. Those who pass the exam will be qualified to train new hunter safety instructors and conduct hunter safety programs for sportsmen, civic and youth groups.

Those interested in attending the workshop should write for application forms to James Gilpin, Director of Conservation Education, Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources, Capital Plaza, Frankfort, Ky. 40601. Application cards must be filled out and returned no later than Sept. 21.

The clinic for the Greater Louisville area will be held on Saturday, Oct. 20 at the Jefferson Gun Club, Bullitt county, Brocks, Ky., on Old South Park Road, to certify instructors and those wishing to secure Hunter Safety Cards to qualify as safe hunters. These cards are necessary for those going out West to hunt this fall because several western states require hunters to pass a Hunter Safety Test before they can purchase hunting licenses. This clinic will be held from 9:30
