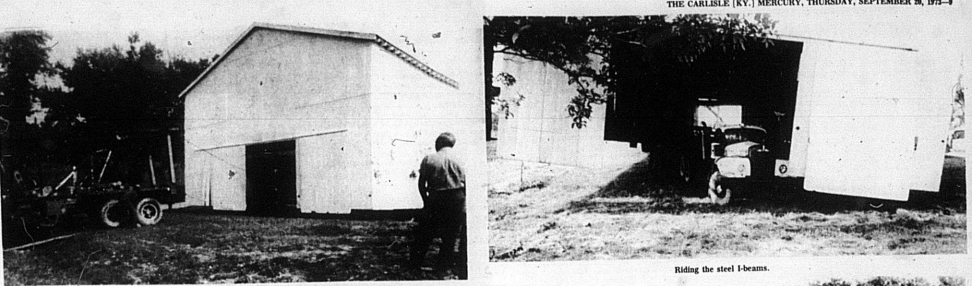

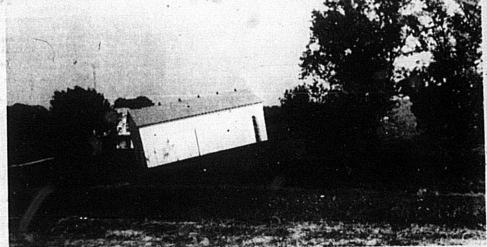

Corps releases Cave Run Lake project draft

The draft Environmental Impact Statement on the Cave Run Lake project near Morehead, Ky., has been released for review and comment by the Louisville Engineer District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

The document, which has been distributed to Federal, State and local agencies and various interested groups, organizations and individuals may be obtained by writing to: Louisville District, U.S. Army Corp of Engineers, Post Office Box 59, Louisville, Ky. 40201.

According to the Corps, Cave Run Lake is a multi-purpose reservoir project located on the Licking River near Farmers, Ky. and about 10 miles west of Morehead. The lake will provide for flood damage reduction, recreation opportunities, preservation and enhancement of fish and wildlife resources, and improve the quality of water flow along the lower Licking River. The project essentially controls run off from a 184 square mile watershed. Cave Run Lake is scheduled for completion during 1974.
