DDT cards mailed to local farmers

Post cards have been mailed to Nicholas county farmers asking if they have used DDT or TDE on their tobacco this year. Eugene Letcher, Nicholas County AEC Committee Chairman, stated today.

Mr. Letcher urged all farmers to read these cards very carefully this year. Samples of tobacco will be taken on the warehouse floor to determine if any restricted chemicals have been used on the tobacco. The use of these restricted chemicals makes the tobacco ineligible for price support.

Homemakers meet

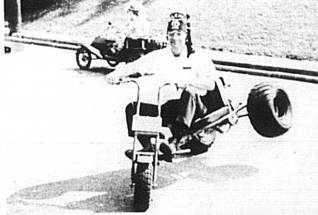
