

Dr. East to address home ec group



Dr. Marieje East, past president of American Home Economics Association, an educator known for her work with families, and a University of Kentucky law student involved in women's rights movement, will address the home economics group at the Kentucky Home Economics Association in Bowling Green April 24.

Margie H. Wilson, County Extension Agent, will join the more than 300 home economists from across the state at the Red Carpet Inn in Bowling Green for this meeting.

Dr. M. O'Neal Weeks, Assistant Professor in the Department of Human Development and Family Relations, College of Home Economics, University of Kentucky, will speak on "The Family and the Crisis of Change," April 6.

On Friday afternoon, Dr. Marieje East, past president of AHEA, will be the keynote speaker discussing future directions of home economics in a transient society.

Group discussion will follow on future directions of home economics programs to meet needs of people as related to societal changes.

The student section of KHEA is sponsoring a legislative report on women's rights presented by Ms. Pam Elam, a University of Kentucky law student at the Friday luncheon.

Other features of the program include a film "A More Abundant Life" by Alistair Cooke, recognition of outstanding students and the understanding home economics teacher, and a scholarship award, and election of officers for 1974-75. Tours will be conducted by Hobson House, Kentucky Library and Museum, and Western Kentucky University Department of Home Economics.

Banquet speaker will be Mrs. Mary Allen Jolley, Director of Public Affairs of AHEA on "Relevance of Our Public Image."

Water Enforcement Division prepares for boating season

Two recent developments will enable Kentucky's water enforcement personnel to step up their activity during the opening boating season, said Doug Shoulters, administrator of the state Division of Water Enforcement in the Department of Transportation.

The 1974 General Assembly's passage of House Bill 390 gives officers in the Division of Highway Enforcement the authority to enforce state boating laws. "This will give us 70 additional enforcement officers to police the Commonwealth's waterways during holidays and other peak activity periods," said Shoulters.

"Another recent development which will help," he said, "is the addition of 12 new patrol boats to our fleet."

Shoulters outlined some of the laws which the Division of Water Enforcement is responsible for enforcing, and of which boat owners should be aware. All motorboats primarily used in Kentucky must be registered and numbered in Kentucky. However, boats registered in other states may use Kentucky's waterways up to 60 days without re-registering. The registration certificate in either case must be on board at all times.

It is against Kentucky law to pollute the waters by any means, and all tags should be kept on board and used.

House Bill 174, which was passed in the 1974 General Assembly, makes it illegal to operate a boat on Kentucky waters without a muffler to insure quietness of operation, except during authorized races, regatta or trial runs for same. This law should become effective by July of 1974.

The federal boating regulations, which became effective in October of 1973, require boats 16 feet in length and over to carry a wearable flotation device (life preserver) for each person on board.

The law also requires that at least one throwable device, such as a buoyant cushion or ring buoy, be on board. Boats less than 16 feet in length, including all canoes and kayaks, are required only to have a personal flotation device (not necessarily wearable) on board for each passenger.

Boaters advised boaters to closely inspect the seaworthiness of their boats and equipment before going out on the water. "Life preservers are especially susceptible to damage due to dry rotting during the winter," he noted.

Federal boating laws require that all personal flotation devices be in good, serviceable condition.
