

# Aid dispatched to tornado victims

FRANKFORT—Departments of Kentucky state government, coordinated by Civil Defense teams, and other local agencies are working together to aid the countless victims of Wednesday night's tornadoes that swept 25 Kentucky counties.

Larry L. Arnett, plans and operations officer in the Frankfort Civil Defense office, said that representatives of all state agencies are coordinating efforts through that office to provide assistance and begin repairs on the widespread destruction.

Civil Defense teams were sent to force to all affected areas. Arnett said to report casualties and damage estimates. Reported fatalities number 78, he added, with Brandenburg, in Macon county, suffering the greatest loss where 30 were confirmed dead.

Made to county, including the Richmond-Whiteside area, was the second hardest hit with 30 reported deaths.

Other fatality figures include Clinton county with four; Lincoln county, six; Jefferson county, five; and Franklin county, four.

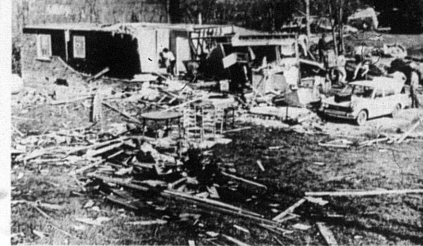
Arnett noted that the fatality most of urban areas is probably definite, but personnel "are still going out in rural areas to check on the situation. Damage estimates are still in the first stages," he said, and that isolation of the undoubtedly reach into the millions of dollars.

Gov. Wendell H. Ford declared this state a disaster area and kept a round-the-clock vigil Wednesday night and local officials. Early Thursday morning, he began an inspection tour of the damaged areas and later met with federal disaster assistance administrators to negotiate for emergency funds and assistance.

Civil Defense teams aided local officials in establishing numerous shelters for the countless victims throughout the state.

Ford announced that the Department of Agriculture is operating a food distribution service for any area where food shortages as a result of the disaster.

Food stored in warehouses and schools is being used for the program and distributed by Civil Defense and local agencies. Ford said distribution

# Kay's Kitchen

This Easter column is for a large family, but a dinner to serve four or six persons. Turkey or ham is more economical for the larger family. This Easter menu is thinking about Cornish hens. Since you will be buying them fresh, have your butcher cut the birds in half for you.

**CORNISH HEENS**  
3 Cornish hens, 1 1/2 lbs. in half  
1/2 lemons salted  
1/2 lemons monosodium glutamate  
1/2 cups orange juice  
1/2 cup butter or margarine  
1/2 teaspoon ground ginger  
2 teaspoons instant minced onion  
1/2 pepper sauce  
1 teaspoon coriander  
1/2 cup toasted sliced almonds  
2 oranges, cut in quarters  
These hens, rice and hot dry. Sprinkle halves on both sides with salt and monosodium glutamate. Heat butter in large skillet. Add halves, three at a time, brown on both sides, removing as browned. Return all halves to skillet; add orange juice and peel, onion, ginger, and pepper sauce. Cover and simmer until tender. Arrange halves on platter and garnish with almonds and sliced almonds.
