May another 50,000 will be released into this 5,000-acre Lake County lake.

"The experiment will last a year. Zagar said. We'll make periodic checks of the fingerlings, and if at the end of the year we find very few of them, we'll know positively about the low survival

rate."

Zagar said the marking process is not harmful to the fish and most of them should retain fluorescent pigment for up to one year.

First introduced in 1959, the marking

system allows 10 to 25 fingerlings to be marked at one time. Previous marking systems like tagging and tattooing required much more time because the individual handling of fish was required.
