

### National Day of Prayer April 30 called for by United States Senate

The U.S. Senate has passed a historic resolution recently proclaiming April 30 as a National Day of Humiliation, Fasting and Prayer. This is the first time the United States has taken such an historic step since the Civil War in 1863. The resolution, modeled after Lincoln's proclamation, was introduced in the U.S. Senate by Senator Hatfield (R-Ore.). Lincoln called citizens to unite in prayer for their homes and churches during the Civil War at a time when the country had reached a low ebb. It proposed his resolution at the Union. "We witness a country torn apart by division and lacking the spiritual foundation which would restore its reason and purpose."

FRANKFORT—The poet T.S. Eliot called April the cruelest month, and from the disapproval of a great many Kentuckians, April 3 will long be remembered as one of the cruelest days in the Commonwealth's history. It was only this day a host of thousands clamored against the quarter of Kentucky's counties, having a terrible toll of death and destruction in their wake. It was also the day U.S. Senator Marlow Cook failed to name a successor for his reelection campaign before the midnight deadline.

There is little doubt Cook will recall April 3 as a cruel date in his political career. And, Secretary of State Thelma Stovall will probably look back on that stormy day as the beginning of one of the most unpleasant episodes in her long career. The first rind of Cook's legal attempt to have his name placed on the May 1972 primary ballot was met with a storm of protest and over the Kentucky Court of Appeals, it might be the best time to look at the situation. Both Cook and the Secretary of State have shown a complete ignorance of the implications of the 1970 law requiring the treasurer's name. At the very least it is disturbing that United States Senator and Kentucky Secretary of State would not be aware of the legal requirements of a four-year-old election law.

Further, the Senator and the Secretary of State should know, like we know, that ignorance of the law is no defense. E.E. Feltz's defense centers mainly on the fact that there is no "substantial compliance" with that state election law.
