## Old Fort Harrod - takes to wheels

Old Fort Harrod State Park in Harrodsburg will soon be celebrating its 200th birthday and for this celebration the Fort has taken the wheels to the road. In fact, it's taken to wheels! To commemorate the Fort's upcoming birthday, the Fort's superintendent and recently dedicated a mobile Fort Harrod education information center. Built on a 30-foot mobile home frame, the center is a replica of the Fort Harrod stockade.

The mobile unit, containing scale replicas and pictures of Fort Harrod and Harrodsburg and Harrodsburg, has been designed to visit schools and to participate in parades and festivals throughout the state.

It has been scheduled tentatively to participate in Nicholas county's parade on Saturday afternoon, June 29, and remain on display until Sunday, June 30, as part of the county's 175th anniversary and Bicentennial Celebration, June 25-30.

It also will serve as an information center to visitors to Harrodsburg. The unit will be on an information center at the Harrodsburg Historical Society.

Through the unit, the "Sims said," to take Harrodsburg to the people and, in turn, take people everywhere they visit us, especially during our Bicentennial celebration.

The name for the unit came from nine-year-old Bryant Lee Mosley, a Harrodsburg student, and his sister, Elementary School in Harrodsburg, the winner of the Name-the-Mobile Fort contest.

The contest recently was held among students in the area to arouse their interest in the traveling Fort Harrod exhibit.

For his winning entry, Bryant was presented with a \$25 check from the Harrodsburg Bicentennial Committee and was a ride on the Harrodsburg Heritage Center in the Derby Parade, June 2, in Louisville.

Bryant also captured the right for the Harrod Elementary School to be the first site to have the mobile unit display its name.

The mobile unit will be on the school grounds through April 17. Not only did the unit's name come from the community but also the concept and funds for the project. Alan Whitnack, a member of the Harrodsburg Bicentennial Committee explained the idea for the center capsule.

## Treasury takes immediate action

The Department of the Treasury has taken immediate action to speed replacement of or payment for, U.S. Savings Bonds lost, stolen, or destroyed in the disaster areas of Alabama, Georgia, Indiana, Kentucky, Ohio, and Tennessee adversely affected by the recent tornadoes. The emergency procedure is effective at once and will be in effect through June 30.

Under the emergency procedure, the six-month waiting period on replacement of lost Bonds is waived. At the same time, the Treasury has authorized paying agents to pay any Series E Bonds in hardship cases, even though the Bonds have not been held for the required two months from issue date.

The Treasury announced that it requires having replacement forms sent to the Bureau of the Public Debt, 205 Clark St., Chicago, Ill. 60606. Quick replacement of Savings Bonds in time of emergency is possible, because they are registered securities, with names and the addresses of owners kept on file.
