FRANKFORT—The National Labor Relations Board recently took the hot potato out of Governor Wendell Ford's hands when the NLRB took the picketing situation at Highpoint in Harlan county to Judge Swinferton's federal court last week.

Judge Swinferton earlier had limited United Mine Worker pickets to six at Highpoint, but between 40 and 100 pickets appeared at the mine all last week and Southern Labor Union miners could not get to their jobs at the mine.

The UMW claims they have only six pickets at the mine and all of the others belonged to the SLL. Some have left their jobs in protest over firing two SLL members.

In a picketing mob such as this, how do you tell which union, or if they belong to any union for that matter? They don't wear badges. It's a matter of trust to employ.

Governor Ford met with UMW President Arnold Miller July 22nd in a mutual agreement announced at a press conference here that the governor from Harlan county and Miller agreed to limit pickets to a "reasonable number," but he refused to define what he thinks is a reasonable number. Since that time State Police have not been at the mine entrance to control the pickets and SLL members have not tried to cross picket lines to avoid violence.

The meeting here followed a mass meeting of UMW members in Harlan county the Sunday before.

In his statement to the press, the governor said the "State Police will not be used to escort strikers across the picket line." A newsman called his attention to the fact that Highpoint miners had a valid contract with

Eastover under the SLL, but this didn't keep his statement from being on TV news programs across the state.

The governor told newsmen he would preserve law and order in Harlan county, but since that time State Police have made only routine patrols of the highway that passes the road entering mine property, and a mass of pickets have kept Highpoint miners from their jobs where they earn \$44 a day plus production bonus of 40 cents a ton for all coal mined. They produce about 1,800 tons a day.

In a letter to this column, dated July 27, a Highpoint miner said, "At this time we have not been able to return to work although a Federal Judge issued a temporary order limiting pickets to six in number. After the judge issued his order, we drove to the mine entrance July 26, but the pickets were there 60, blocking the entrance and about 40 above and below the entrance, so we again did not try to force our way in. I am beginning to doubt if there is any branch of our government that can enforce law and order when a powerful labor union is involved. What a price to pay, when there are men who want to work, but are denied this right because they belong to a small labor union and not one of the giants."

I also have copies of two mimeographed letters sent to UMW members and petitioners in Harlan county, not signed, only as "retired brothers." One letter says, "The way I see it, I'm retired, because I was way 1 go. Eastover has increased their wages in Highpoint. The mines that are under Southern Labor, so when they come back from vacation, we need to be there with a picket line that reaches a mile, with at least 2,000 of us and pen and ink let the company know
