APPEALS TO THE PEOPLE OR SENATORS

I appreciate the fact that the Secretary of Commerce has acted to restrict the movement of such equipment. I believe his decision was an executive session. The plan is to exhibit by U.S. firms of law enforcement equipment at a fair, to be held in Moscow during the Aug. 14-28 period.

Equipment scheduled to be exhibited included fingerprint detection and analysis, voice identification, psychophysical stress valuation machinery—machinery which could be used not only against minority groups and political dissidents of the Soviet Union but in espionage and counter-espionage activities.

In questioning during the executive session, I elicited what I consider to be several extremely significant facts. First, in many cases, the sophisticated equipment to be displayed is not available for sources other than those in the United States. Secondly, once a machine is obtained, it can usually be duplicated.

In my opinion, this raises serious questions about the advisability of exhibiting such equipment in the Soviet Union, where the most logical purchaser is the KGB, the State Police.

I do not believe we either want to or should place ourselves in the position of making available equipment which could be used by a government to deprive its citizens of what we could consider basic civil rights or perhaps be used against us. Such a move is not justifiable. It does not make sense.

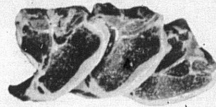
