Selective Service honors two here

Ma. Virginia Fryman and Paul E. Hall, residents of Nicholas county were recently honored by Col. Taylor L. Davidson, State Director for Selective Service. Mr. Hall (pictured) and Ms. Fryman were presented with a certificate of appreciation Aug. 19, by Drene N. Walton, on behalf of Col. Davidson, for their "outstanding service in Nicholas county." Col. Davidson also complimented them on their public spirit and willingness to serve as uncompensated registrars over the past several months.
Mrs. Walton took the opportunity to remind young men of Nicholas county that federal law still requires them to register with Selective Service when they become 18 years of age. Registration is quick and easy, and should take place within a 60-day period beginning 30 days prior to their 18th birthday.
"If you are not registered, you should do so as soon as possible, even though you may be late," she added.
During the school year, if you are a student, you may register with the counselors at Nicholas County High School. Non-students and young men wishing to register during the other months when school is not in session may register with the Circuit Court Clerk's office with Miss Beulah M. Hughes, another public spirited woman registered with Selective Service when

ASCS official emphasizes safety measures

"Although observance of National Farm Safety Week officially ended July 31, farmers in Nicholas county should continue the observance by re-examining their farming operations and eliminating unsafe practices," reports Paul E. Hall of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS) county office.
"The importance of farm and home safety is about 170,000 farm accidents a year, with 200,000 occurring

in the home. Nicholas county farmers have been asked to place the slow-moving vehicle emblem on farm equipment traveling on roads, install protective equipment at work, install rollover protection equipment on tractors, drive at safe speeds and be aware of the need for general safety practices. "Many accidents can be prevented by eliminating hazards," said Mr. Hall.
