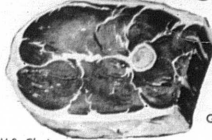

Kay's Kitchen

Since this is the cranberry season I have some new all time best new recipes using this colorful fruit. Cranberries are not only delicious but add color to the meal. The cranberry pudding I had for dessert on Thanksgiving Day was easy to make and so good. So you know I didn't go away without this recipe. It is easy to make and the sauce, and part of the pudding can be made ahead of time.

CRANBERRY PUDDING
1 1/2 cup sugar
1 cup flour
1 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
1 cup milk
Mix all together and add 1 cup whole uncooked cranberries cut in half. Bake in a buttered 8x8 inch cake pan at 350 degrees until golden. About 30 to 45 minutes. Serve hot, with sauce. SERVES 8.

SALAD
1 cup sugar
1 stick butter (1/2 pound)
1 small can evaporated milk
1 teaspoon vanilla
Cream. Soak minute onion and garlic in butter until garlic is yellow. Quarter garlic to get more flavor. Remove garlic. Add flour and blend in cream and milk, stirring until smooth. Add cranberries and cook, stirring occasionally, until tender. If sauce is too thick add milk to make, then add milk.

The sauce can be made ahead of time and reheated.

You can add syrup and a bit of butter to your sauce and it will be even over or cream. It would be a delicious sauce over most any meat that calls for a sauce.

To serve something different in the way of vegetables I always had. However, this coming holiday season by serving the two following vegetables. The carrot recipe will even be enjoyed by those who say they don't like carrots. This recipe sort of just wears trying to have something different.

COMPANY CELERY
1 bunch celery
1/2 cup butter
1 small can water chestnuts
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon onion powder
1 teaspoon chopped parsley
1/2 cup pepper to taste
Clean and cut celery into one inch pieces. Melt butter in heavy saucepan. Saute celery over medium heat, stirring until lightly browned, about five minutes. Add sliced water chestnuts. Sprinkle with basil and chopped parsley. Add onion, salt and pepper to taste, cover and simmer until celery is tender but not mushy. This recipe may be doubled easily and it still tastes, which is not always the case. Most of the time it is better to make two separate ones.

8 medium carrots
Salt to taste
1 onion minced
1 garlic clove
1 1/2 tablespoons butter
1 tablespoon flour
1/2 cup canned tomatoes
1/2 cup sausage
Chop and saute in oil in a skillet. Add carrots. Boil in salted water about 10 minutes. Drain. Sauté minced onion and garlic in butter until garlic is yellow. Quarter garlic to get more flavor.
