Kay's Kitchen

The following country ham recipe was sent to Kay's Kitchen and is good served with it.
We only have country ham at Christmas time I thought this would be a good time to publish it. You may want to bake the slices from a ham and then bake the other half for unexpected company during the holidays.
BARED SLICES
OLD COUNTRY HAM
Cut all many slices as needed of Old Country Ham ½ inch thick. Trim most of the fat from around the edges and cut the edges so it won't curl up.
Brown each slice on both sides. Then place the slices in a large skillet cover with milk, place a 250 cover over for several hours or until it is tender enough to cut with a fork.
Place the slices on a platter and the milk gravy in a gravy boat. It is a meat dish that has been served in my in-law's family for 25 years.
It is made well with onion salad and cream, and new potatoes, baked apples, and broccoli casserole. I've seen, and it's all of pound cake making a good dessert. Hot home-made bread is good served with it.
Since I thought perhaps someone else might like to have the recipe, I really makes a delicious moist Christmas cake and less expensive than most cakes calling for fruits and nuts.
CARROT CAKE
4 whole eggs
2 cups all purpose flour
2 cups grated carrots
2 cups sugar
1 cup vegetable oil
1 cup chopped nuts
1 teaspoon baking powder
Sift dry ingredients together. Add sugar, carrots, vegetable oil and nuts. Mix well. Bake 25 degrees in other layers or tube pan. If using tube pan baking time will be longer.
