average price in November, the latest month we have a report on, was 41.4 cents a pound, compared with the March peak of 97.2 cents.

Hall advises wool producers to keep careful records of 1974 marketings and all receipts, sales slips, and the like, if there should be incentive payments made on 1974 wool marketings.

The use of wool is expected to be on the increase, considering the fuel situation, but the national production of wool will likely be below the 14 million pounds produced in 1973.
