## Kay's Kitchen

Try these summer coolers for yourself, you, family and your friends. It is a lot more trouble than opening a can or bottle but it will be something different. If you are watching your diet stay away from the ice cream floats but you can enjoy the fruit drinks.

- MINT SPARKLE**  
1 (16 oz) can fruit juice  
3 cups unsweetened pineapple juice  
4 cup lemon juice  
3/4 cup ginger ale  
Combine fruit juice and 1 1/2 cups water. Heat and stir over low heat till jelly mella. Cool. Add pineapple juice and lemon juice.
- LEMONADE SYRUP**  
Bait for 5 minutes 2 cups sugar; 1 cup water; rind of 2 lemons cut in thin strips; dash of salt. Cook and add the juice of 2 lemons. Strain and store in covered jar.
- FRUIT GINGER ALE**  
Combine and boil for 5 minutes: 1 cup sugar and 1 cup water. Cool then add juice of 1 orange and juice of 1/2 lemon. Chill. Just before serving add 1 quart of chilled ginger ale. Serve over ice.
- GINGER ALE AND GRAPE JUICE**  
Combine and boil for 5 minutes: 1 cup sugar, 1/2 cup water, 1/2 cup grape juice, 1/2 cup orange juice. Just before serving add 1 part of ginger ale.
