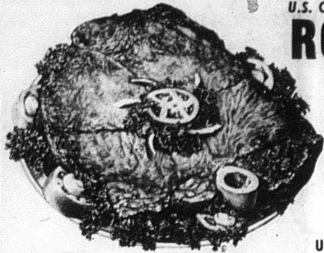

Blue Lick Union Church plans Homecoming in July

The Blue Lick Union Church is making plans to observe a Homecoming July 6 and 7. It will be recalled the original church on this site was constructed during the Civil War period. The intervention of this conflict was not anticipated, in fact the construction of the church was delayed because the Old Werneck Covered Bridge that spanned the Licking River at Blue Lick was burned in 1863. Due to arson, a direct result of hostilities. However, the Trustees, the congregation and contractor J.H. Pumprey kept faith with their God and in each other and the church was completed and dedicated in 1864.

This historical "Old Battle Ground Church" served faithfully and well the four Protestant faiths of that time and for many years, at least until Feb. 11, 1954, when fire of undetermined origin destroyed the church. The congregation was summoned by Daniel E. Wells, chairman of the Board, to assemble in the Blue Lick Masonic Hall on the following Lord's Day, to determine the wishes of the congregation relative to the restoration of their beloved place to worship their Creator. The congregation, almost with one accord, resolved to make every effort possible to restore their church. Presently only the Christian faith has regular services.

This Homecoming marks 110 years a church has stood on this site. The original church which burned in 1954, after 90 years, was rebuilt and dedicated Oct. 21, 1964, and for 20 years the restored church has been in service. A special welcome is extended to all who can attend this reunion. It is hoped all former ministers who can, will be present, and all who formerly lived here will plan to attend. Everybody is welcome.
