Dear Mrs. Fisher:

In a recent issue of the Todd County Standard, Elkton, I noticed you were requesting the two recipes which I am enclosing. Fried pies and Pickled pig's feet. These recipes are from the Hand-Me-Down-Cookbook by Cherry Parker and Frances Bradsher, (mother and daughter) former Elktonians and whom I know personally. So, you see, at heart, I am still a little Kentucky from Elkton, but a transplant to Florida for 48 years. I look forward to your column each week and have enjoyed using many of your recipes. I will send you a dollar for every fried pie I ate throughout my childhood days. Kay's Kitchen column is quite an asset to the Home Paper, as I call it.

FRIED DRIED APPLE PIES
1 lb. of dried fruit (apples, apricots or peaches)
1 cup sugar
1 cup water
