

James A. Carter, native of Nicholas county, was employed in The C.C. Cole Company in 1952—and bought the business from R.T. Fisher in 1966.

Mr. Carter, who continued with the same high standards in leadership, character, and fine good brands of men's clothes as in the past, purchased the building in 1973. He soon after restored the side of the building into office space as it was in 1900. These were completed in 1974. The Barber Shop has always been a Barber Shop throughout the years.

In 1974 he expanded his business space into a private business office and an altering room, with an extra office on basement ground which he has planned for in his future growth.

The interior was completely remodeled in Old English decor and made Carter's Clothier one of a kind in this section of the country.

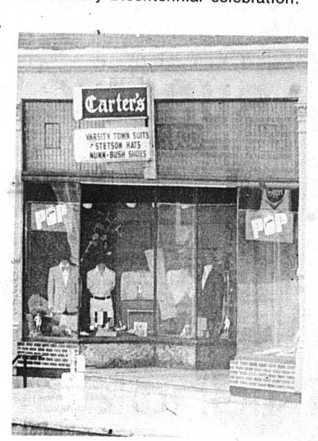

Chester Craycraft Cole went to Moorefield in 1894 and opened a mercantile store which he operated until 1900 when he built the C.C. Cole and Company building and founded a men's and boys' store there. It has remained a men's store throughout the 74 years it has existed.

The second and third floors were apartments. The front room of the basement was, and still is, a Barber Shop. The adjoining basement room was used as a Restaurant until 1934, when it was occupied by W.P.A. as a sewing room until 1940. At this time it became a pool room and remained so until 1972.

Owners of the building located at Main and Broadway have been 1900-1926 C.C. Cole; 1926-1931 Chester Cole; 1931-1938 C.C. Ratliff; 1938-1939 William Phillips; 1939-1962 Clarence Phillips; 1962-1969 Mrs. William Stahl; 1969-1973 R.T. Fisher and 1973 James A. Carter.

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
