Officers, awards for 4-H featured

Leader training, career exploration, election of new officers, and award presentations to friends of the Kentucky 4-H program were featured at the recent Kentucky 4-H Week in Lexington.

Nearly 900 young people and 150 adults from throughout the state attended this annual event at the University of Kentucky. A two-session conference for selected 4-H'ers, the state 4-H Week included separate programs for seniors (ages 14-19) and for younger 4-H'ers (ages 11-13).

At Senior 4-H Congress, the older 4-H'ers explored career opportunities, developed plans for best leadership programs, and elected new state 4-H officers. The younger boys and girls at the Junior 4-H Conference visited UK departments, toured points of interest in the Bluegrass area, and learned

about the opportunities available to them through 4-H. Selected as state officers to represent Kentucky 4-H'ers during the coming year were president—Steve Harshbarger, 18, Shelbyville; vice-president—Bill Miller, 18, Bigsbyville; and Secretary—Bugs Solder, 15, Franklin. The election followed nominations of candidates in area "countryside" earlier this year; area "primaries", which narrowed the candidate list to three nominees for each office, after Kentucky 4-H week opened, and intensive campaigning among the senior delegates, who used voting machines in choosing the new state officers.

Several awards were presented during the week to organizations which have given particular support to the Kentucky 4-H Program. Meritrons presented annually by the Kentucky Association of Extension 4-H Agents to a daily and a weekly newspaper for their local support of 4-H, were given to the Danville Advocate-News and the Danville Herald. Awarded to the major speakers during the week were U.S. Sen. Marlow Cook, Kentucky, Lt. Gov. Julian Carroll, and Dr. Tom Hazzag, North Carolina minister and pastor.

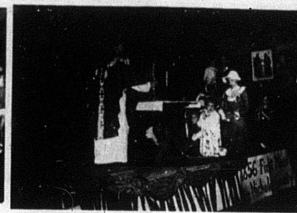

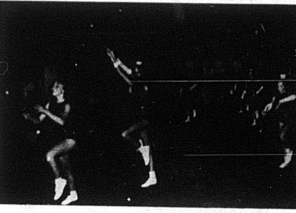

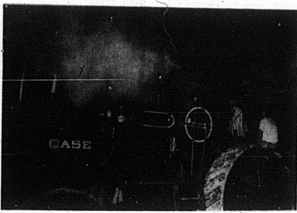

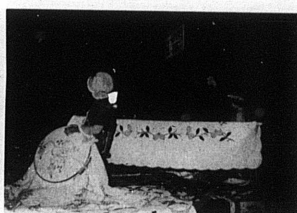
