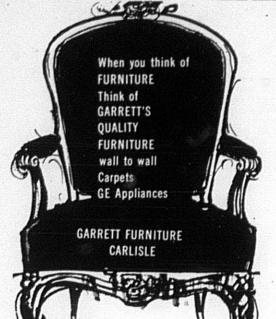

KEA delegates adopt resolutions at convention

Delegates to this year's Kentucky Education Association (KEA) convention held in Louisville recently adopted strong resolutions that—Put the 27,000-member organization on record in support of using as one means of desegregating schools.

—Direct KEA officers and staff to "initiate and support" the establishment of public employee coalitions at the state and local levels in Kentucky.

—Rescind authorization previously given the KEA Commission on Professional Negotiation to consult and work with other public employee groups in writing a bargaining bill or bills.

—Assign "the highest priority" to enactment of a state negotiation law in 1975 as well as enactment of the federal bargaining bill that is part of the National Education Association (NEA) legislative program.

—Call upon the Kentucky Teachers' Retirement System board of trustees to use the shareholder voting power coming from teachers' money invested in oil stock to demand reforms from within the industry for the benefit of the American consumer. The same resolution supports proposed legislation to roll back fuel prices to Dec. 1 levels and bring about complete public disclosure of information on petroleum supplies and reserves.

—Ask for a special committee study to be presented to next year's KEA Delegate Assembly, on the need for a full-time president of KEA.

Consumer comments -- franchise investors

Small investors have recently been joining the ranks of franchisees by the lure of self-employment at what are sometimes believed minimal risks. Many franchise businesses are legitimate, but all too many have promised large potential earnings while understating the cost of purchasing and operating the franchise.

Investing in a franchise requires a considerable amount of capital, therefore, prospective investors should carefully examine all aspects of the agreement before becoming legally involved.

Before signing any agreement or investing any money the following points should be considered:

- Who is the franchisor? Is it well-known and reputable or potentially?
- "By-night" operation? If the name of a well-known personality is being used, is it merely for show or will this personality make substantial personal contribution?
- Is the franchise product or service of proven value or just a gimmick? Is there an adequate market in the territory and will consumer demand for the product grow over time?
- What is the cost of the franchise? Inquire about all future charges and understand how much cash today is needed to purchase the franchise.
- Does the franchisor provide training, management and advertising assistance? If a franchisee says no experience is necessary and is offering only a short indoctrination session, consider whether the training will be sufficient to allow you to become competitive with established businesses.
- Some franchise agreements include provisions in which the franchisor promises to provide training, advertising and merchandising advice. Obtain specific information to the types of service and the more it is written into the franchise agreement or contract.
- Beware of "get rich quick" promises. Don't be misled by promotions of "documented" stories of prior franchisees who have struck it big.
- Never accept franchise representation concerning potential profits at face value. Always ask to see certified profit figures of franchisees operating in comparable markets and at a volume level realistic attainable.
- Contact current and/or former franchisees for information about the actual success of ventures. There is no legitimate reason for the franchisee to refuse to provide the names of franchisees. If there is an attempt to hide something, consumers should forget about investing in the franchise.
