INSPECTION PERIOD FOR THE PROPERTY TAX ASSESSMENT ROLL

The Nicholas County property tax roll will be open for inspection from May 20 through May 24, 1974. Under the supervision of the property valuation administrator or one of his deputies, any property owner may inspect the tax roll to check the assessment of his property and compare it with the assessment of comparable property to determine whether it is equitably assessed. The tax roll may not be inspected for any other purpose.

This is the January 1, 1974 assessment on which state, county, and school taxes for 1974 will be due on September 15, 1974.

The tax roll is in the office of the property valuation administrator in the county courthouse and may be inspected between the hours of 8:30 A.M. and 4:30 P.M.

COAL LIQUEFACTION
During the past week I have joined with other members of the Kentucky Congressional delegation in urging that the first federally-subsidized coal liquefaction demonstration plant be located in Kentucky. The decision on its location is imminent. In fact the decision may have been made by the time this column appears. But I believe Kentucky is the best possible location.
Reasons of where this first plant is located, Kentucky will be a major beneficiary of any progress in coal research that will permit the use of coal to supply energy while avoiding adverse environmental effects. When such a method is developed, it will mean a tremendous increase in demand for coal and that will produce more jobs and economic progress for the Commonwealth.

In a letter to Secretary of Interior Rogers Morton, I outlined what I thought to be compelling reasons for locating a demonstration plant in Kentucky.
Kentucky is the nation's number one coal producing state.
Kentucky and its governor, Wendell H. Ford, have made a great commitment to coal research than any other state, with the Kentucky legislature just recently authorizing a commitment of up to \$50 million in State funds over the next five years.
The University of Kentucky has an outstanding ongoing coal research program which has received constant support from the State.
Ashland, Ohio, located in Ashland, Kentucky, has also made great investments in coal research and probably has a much greater capacity to undertake such a program as any company in the field.
Kentucky has an abundance of able and willing workers who could operate the plant above and beyond what we have elsewhere.
We have all of the needed ingredients - an abundant supply of coal, ample water and an excellent transportation network.

In short, Kentucky probably has more to gain than any other state, simply because we have an abundant supply of coal - in fact, 20 percent of the nation's reserves. Any successful method developed to utilize coal without polluting the environment can only be of great benefit to Kentucky. I think a review of the facts stated above will show beyond a question that Kentucky is the best location for a demonstration plant to begin utilization of our abundant coal reserves. We have the most to gain and we will make the best effort.

Proposed regulations dealing with disabled, reduction, and termination of payments are: -Increase in income or resources. -Confinement in a public institution. -Refusal to accept or undergo required treatment for drug addiction. -Absence from the United States for 30 or more consecutive days. -Refusal to accept vocational rehabilitation services without good cause. -Loss of U.S. citizenship or permanent residence. -Failure to apply for or obtain benefits under other programs which may be payable to the recipient. -When recipient is no longer blind, disabled, or if he has died.
